- Over 3,500 residents provided emergency food, rental & utility assistance
- 285 clients received mental health counseling
- 679 clients received crisis support and education regarding traumatic situations
- 178 clients received drug/alcohol counseling and treatment including relapse prevention, behavioral therapy, and motivational counseling
- Over 100,000 hot meals delivered to the homes of elderly or disabled individuals
